The service is designed to help with basic instruction on how to use a smart phone effectively and can explain some of the functionality of the device to make it easier for you to understand. If you have been struggling with your phone, pop in to the library where more details can be found.



I am worried about my energy bills because they are very high and I am getting behind with payments. What can I do?

The most important thing is to contact your energy supplier as soon as possible. They have a duty to help you come to a solution and negotiate a payment plan that works for both of you. When making a payment plan, they have to take into account how much you can afford to pay and how much energy you'll use in future. On a payment plan, you'll pay in fixed amounts towards the debt you owe over a set period of time.

If you can't come to an agreement with your supplier about repaying your debt, contact Citizens Advice for help.

Energy bill debt is classed as a priority debt but it's not the only expense people have to deal with. If you are having problems with other bills as well, seek advice on managing debt. Citizens Advice will help you with long-term strategies to cope, and advise you on grants and benefits you may be entitled to.

Another thing you can do is save energy by making sure your home is energy efficient. There are simple changes you can make such as checking your central heating or using your appliances differently. You might also be able to get towards the cost of making bigger energy efficiency changes around your home such as getting a new heating system.



Wikipedia. the online encyclopaedia written and maintained by a community of volunteers, is probably the largest and most-read reference work in history. It was started in 2001 by Jimmy Wales and Larry Sanger.



Last month Sanger published a lengthy essay laying out his journey from scepticism to Christianity. For most of his adult life, Sanger was a committed sceptic, trained in philosophy, not hostile to faith, only unconvinced.

Sanger grew up in the Lutheran Church in the USA, but by his mid-teens, his belief in God was wavering; he had questions: "At some point in my late teens, I remember calling up a pastor—I forget which—to ask skeptical questions. It felt bold for a teenager to do, but I was not merely being rebellious. I really needed help thinking these things through. But the pastor had no clear or strong answers. He seemed to be brushing me off and even to treat me with contempt. It seemed to me he did not care, and if anything, I had the impression that he felt threatened by me. This was a surprise. The damage was quickly done . . ." This unfortunate response from the church minister led Larry Sanger to continue asking questions, studying philosophy in college, obtaining his doctorate and teaching the subject to others. However during these years, he had not asked himself questions about God and how the Bible's story may fit together as a rational way of understanding life.

What persuaded him to reconsider was not one single argument about the existence of God. Any one case taken by itself is considered too weak. But taken together, these multiple lines of evidence—philosophical reasoning, the beauty of the universe, and humanity's deep longings— make belief in God not just plausible but for him the most compelling explanation of reality.

Sanger was impressed also by the way Christians conducted themselves both in person and in online debates: "I observed Christians on social media often (though not always) behaving with maturity and grace, while their critics often acted like obnoxious trolls. Some of my favorite people were Christian, too. And some of them were extremely intelligent."

Curious and determined to find out more about the Bible, he turned to every tool at his disposal—study plans, commentaries, Bible apps, and maps. Sanger was unafraid to ask the difficult questions.

"When I really sought to understand it, I found the Bible far more interesting and—to my shock and consternation—coherent than I was expecting. I looked up answers to all my critical questions, thinking that perhaps others had not thought of issues I saw. I was wrong. Not only had they thought of all the issues, and more that I had not thought of, they had well-worked-out positions about them. I did not believe their answers, which sometimes struck me as contrived or unlikely. But often, they were shockingly plausible. The Bible could sustain interrogation; who knew?"


